Minutes of the meeting of Londesborough Parish Council held on Monday 8th February 2016 in the Reading Rooms, Low Street, at 7.30pm.

Cllr Fisher welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Public Session: there were no members of the public present.

1/16 Apologies Cllr Stephenson, Cllr G Brotherton

2/16 Declaration of Interest : there were no declarations of interest.

3/16 The minutes of meeting held on 14th December 2015 were adopted as a true and correct record and Cllr Fisher signed them as such on behalf of the council.

4/16 To receive the clerk's report on matters being progressed from previous meetings: Pensions Auto- enrolment: the clerk had looked into the fees each of the suggested pension providers charge. The People's Pension has a set up charge. It was agreed choose the NEST Co. which currently has no charges to employers.

Salt stocks: there were still approximately 30 bags of salt in stock. ERYC had replenished the salt bins and heaps around the parish after several telephone calls from the clerk and chairman

Wolds Weighton Liaison Group: the clerk had attended the inaugural meeting. There had been discussions about various subjects including fracking and speeding in villages. Several villages had problems with speeding and there was a mobile flashing speed sign somewhere in the East Riding but it was not clear how to access this. It was agreed that the clerk should contact a ward councillor for advice regarding speeding during the cricket season.

Quarry Traffic: a reply had been received from Ashcourt giving contact details for any complaints about speeding or misconduct by their drivers.

There had been a reply from ERYC saying that it was a condition of the planning approval for the quarry extension that the mineral operator should make a financial contribution to the maintenance of the local roads. When this contribution is received, and the weather improves, work will be done to improve the passing places and damaged verges.

5/16 To consider what action if any the Parish Council should take regarding the proposed withdrawal of a fire engine from Market Weighton.

Cllr Bessey reported on a meeting he had attended in Market Weighton . He explained that the Humberside Fire and Rescue Services had to make substantial savings over the coming years. One

proposal was to withdraw one of the two fire engines from Market Weighton. Councillors were concerned that this would not leave adequate cover for this area. It was decided that councillors would individually take part in the online consultation regarding the cuts.
