Tour de Yorkshire

The first ever Tour de Yorkshire cycle race will take place from Friday, 1 to Sunday, 3 May. The three-day event is a professional international cycle race, secured by Welcome to Yorkshire as part of the legacy of last year's Tour de France Grand Départ.

Stage one on Friday, 1 May will start in Bridlington and finish in Scarborough. Stage two on Saturday, 2 May will start in Selby and finish in York. Stage three on Sunday, 3 May will start in Wakefield and finish in Leeds. Details of the routes are available at letour.yorkshire.com/route-maps

Volunteer Tour Makers from last year's Grand Départ will once again line parts of the route, helping spectators to enjoy the event and give a warm Yorkshire welcome to those from further afield. The Tour de Yorkshire Festival will celebrate the county's fantastic arts and cultural scene in the month leading up to the race weekend.

The race will be televised in the UK and more than 40 countries around the world. If your community is on the route, the Council hopes you'll get involved by showing off villages and towns as the spotlight is shone on East Yorkshire. Bunting-making is under way, flower beds being designed and village fetes planned. The Council hopes your community will have a fantastic Tour de Yorkshire.

Local Grant Fund 2015/16

Following the success of previous years' Local Grant Funds, the scheme has been approved for continuation in 2015/16. Full details have not been confirmed, but it is expected that town and parish councils will be able to apply for up to £3,000.

It is anticipated that the fund will continue to prioritise activities that focus on community resilience and emergency preparedness, including severe weather and flood preparations. Neighbourhood planning workshops

Humber and Wolds RCC is coordinating a series of local information events where you can discuss the potential action you can take within your community.

These events are being added to the next Community Partnership meeting in your area. Parish clerks are being made aware of the dates as they are arranged.

YORSwitch reopens

Residents have again been offered market-leading rates on energy prices. Householders who signed up for this round could save an average of £233 each on their annual energy bills.

More than 2,000 households in the East Riding registered for the YORSwitch scheme. These were combined with other similar initiatives around the UK to create a collective of 30,000 households from more than 100 local authorities.

Because the tariffs achieved by the auction are such good rates, registration for the scheme was reopened until Monday, 16 March.

Funding for Neighbourhood Planning

The Government recently confirmed funding for neighbourhood planning in April 2015 and town and parish councils writing a plan can apply for grants up to £8,000. Locality has organised a workshop in Manchester on Monday, 16 March to provide further information about the support programme. Neighbourhood plans encourage town and parish councils to take an active role in developing local planning policy. The first stage is for them to suggest a designated neighbourhood area, usually following existing parish boundaries. East Riding of Yorkshire Council organises consultation on proposed neighbourhood areas and designates the area, unless there are planning reasons not to.

In February, the Government changed the process for designating neighbourhood areas, introducing timescales for local authorities to determine applications. The changes make it quicker for town and parish councils to see their proposed neighbourhood area designated. The time limits are now:

- 20 weeks, where the area is within two or more local planning authorities
- 8 weeks, where the area is the whole of the area of the parish council
- 13 weeks in all other cases.

Eight town and parish councils in the East Riding already have designated neighbourhood areas. Examination and consultation on main modifications to Local Plan

The emerging East Riding Local Plan establishes planning policies for the next 15 years. It was submitted for examination in April 2014 and the independent planning inspector held a series of public hearing sessions in October and November. It is now in the final stages of being examined by the inspector.

During the hearing sessions, the council suggested a number of amendments to the Local Plan to resolve concerns that the plan may be unsound. These proposed modifications were summarised in a briefing note sent to town and parish councils in November. Consultation on these proposed changes is expected to take place shortly. Town and parish councils will be notified at the start of the consultation period. You can see more details as they are made available on the council's website at eastriding.gov.uk/localplanexam





Thinking about getting involved ?

A national spring clean is being held on Saturday, 21 March - the first day of spring - in partnership with Keep Britain Tidy. It aims to spruce up the country's streets, villages and parks.

New start for leisure centre

East Riding Leisure Beverley will soon be marking the completion of a £1.2 million improvement programme. The new purpose-built, state-of-the-art Tone Zone health and fitness suite will boast an extensive range of high-tech resistance and cardiovascular equipment.

The new facility has doubled in size to house 90 pieces of equipment. There will also be a purpose-built spin-cycling room. The old gym will be converted into a studio to be known as Group X Studio to host fitness classes. Work will start as soon as the new Tone Zone is available to users.

East Riding College, Beverley, has agreed a partnership with the leisure centre to start when the college's new Beverley campus opens in September. Those studying sport coaching, development and fitness qualifications will take theory lessons in the modern £14m campus and benefit from practical sessions using the indoor and outdoor facilities at the centre.

New markets for 2015

A Local Produce Monthly Market will be held in Wednesday Market, Beverley, with stalls selling the very best in locally-produced food and drink. There will be a special launch event on Wednesday, 8 April with fun activities for children.
